The Mwangaza Jitigemee Foundation provides Stella with food, clothes, medical and clinical services and everything needed for school, including tuition fees, uniform, books and school supplies. Currently she is in Standard II at Ukombozi Primary School. Stella is doing very well in school and excited to learn English. After school she likes to read her books and helps with many chores around the orphanage. She is very well liked by the other kids in the orphanage and is often found helping the smaller children. She is very compassionate and will fit well in society.

Stella is not sure what she would like to be when she grows up, but knows she wants to do something to help people, like she was helped.

While visiting SWACCO, Stella loved holding hands and giving us hugs. Coloring with markers was exciting and she was excited to keep one for herself. One day she and a group of girls were taught how to play CandyLand. Once they picked it up, Stella could not stop smiling and laughing with her friends.
